This year Medea Creek students have, once again, the wonderful opportunity to experience hands-on, biological science at Catalina Island Marine Institute (CIMI) on Catalina Island.

#### What and When:

The trip is from Monday, November 17- Wednesday, November 19, 2014. CIMI is a wonderful hands-on science experience in marine biology. Students attending will participate in classes that extend the 7<sup>th</sup> grade science curriculum (classes include Fish/Invertebrates, Tide pooling/Plankton, and Squid Dissection) as well as team building activities that encourage physical challenges (Snorkeling, Sea Kayaking, and Night Snorkel).

#### **Trip Funding\* and Paperwork:**

The suggested, voluntary donation that we ask of parents to fund this trip is \$343.00. This includes transportation via Southwind bus company, Catalina Cruises to the island, room and board at CIMI, and the instructional program itself. The school district no the PFA are able to fund this trip, and it is not a required part of the curriculum; however, it is a highly enriching and engaging experience that we would like to make available to interested 7<sup>th</sup> graders. We rely completely on the suggested donation amount fund this trip. If we do not receive sufficient funds from parents, then the trip will need to be cancelled. - **Paperwork should be turned in to the student's science teacher.** The Student Window will NOT accept paperwork b will take payments if they are in cash.
- LATE paperwork will not be accepted.

#### **Chaperones:**

Parents who would like to attend this year as chaperone are encouraged to apply. Active participation in water activities is required of chaperones, so we ask that you **fill out the attached chaperone application**. The Catalina committee will evaluate all candidates to select the most experienced chaperones for the trips. Chaperones are asked to pay a reduced camp fee (\$172). Chaperones will be required to attend a mandatory meeting on Thursday October 30, 2014 from 5:30-6:15 as well as the rally later that evening at 6:30. **WE NEED YOU!** 

#### Next Steps:

Attend the catalina Rally on Thursday October 30, 2014. Students who are attending CIMI will receive trip slips and further instructions, such as what to bring and what to expect on the trip.
