Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

- Bridge between preschool and Kindergarten
- Students who attend TK attend Kindergarten the following year





Who is eligible to attend TK?

Students who turn 4 on or before September 1, 2025.



TK Program Overview

- 4 hours/day
- Developmentally appropriate materials and curriculum
- Taught by experienced, credentialed teachers
- Maximum 10:1 student-teacher ratio (1 teacher, 1 instructional aide)
- Access to elementary counselor
- Collaboration between OPUSD preschool, TK, and K teachers





TK focuses on...

- Students feeling safe and happy in a school environment
- Fostering a love of learning
- Play-based learning
- Learning-to-learn skills:
 - Routines and expectations
 - Following directions
 - Making connections
 - Problem solving



Social/Emotional/Behavioral Learning

- How to identify and manage feelings/emotions
- How to build relationships, share common interests, and learn from and celebrate differences
- How to work cooperatively
- Conflict resolution
- Self-advocacy
- Perseverance
- Infused throughout the day



Early Academic Learning

- Preschool/TK Learning Foundations
- Language Development
- Pre-Literacy
 - Letters and sounds, concepts of print, vocabulary, etc.
- Pre-Math
 - Counting, graphing, number ID, 1:1 correspondence, etc.
- Pre-Writing
 - Holding a pencil, drawing, coloring, etc.
- Social Studies
- Science

K Program Overview

- 5 hours/day
- Developmentally appropriate materials and curriculum
- Taught by experienced, credentialed teachers
- Common Core State Standards (ELA, Math) & Next Generation Science Standards
- Elementary counselor and behavior specialists support
- Collaboration between OPUSD TK and K teachers





K focuses on...

- Feeling safe and happy in a school environment
- Fostering a love of learning
- Play-based learning
- Academic content
 - Foundational Reading Skills
 - Mathematical practices
 - Thinking like a scientist
 - Hands-on, active learning





K Curriculum

- Learning Common Core State Standards through experience
- Focus on hands-on, engaging , differentiated learning, creating meaning through doing
- Early reading and writing foundations - phonemic and orthographic awareness, phonics, alphabetic knowledge









Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)

- Universally screen students 3x/year in early literacy and early math skills
- Trained interventionists work with students needing additional support in small group settings
- Progress monitoring provides data on the efficacy of the intervention and informs next steps
- Early intervention helps ensure a solid literacy and numeracy foundation
