DESCRIPTIONS

High School Math Instructional Workshop

Open to all high school students enrolled in math. There is a strong focus on instruction in Pre-Algebra, Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Finite and Math Analysis. Students should bring all math materials to class each week.

Middle School Math Tutoring

Open to all students grades 6-8 interested in gathering with other students to study and work on their assignments.

DESCRIPTIONS (cont'd)

High School Science Instructional Workshop

Open to all high school students, this instructional workshop is designed to further develop scientific literacy and analytical thinking skills for students enrolled in: Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Psychology. Students will participate in a wide variety of individual and group activities to understand natural phenomena and explore how science works. As per the goals of the Next Generation Science Standards, emphasis will be on science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, disciplinary core ideas, and technological applications of scientific knowledge (STEM).

Writer's Workshop

Offered to all students grades 4 - 8. Young writers explore a wide variety of writing from fiction to non-fiction. We practice different ways of writing such as expository, persuasive and narrative. Some examples of fiction writing includes science fiction, superheroes, letter writing, reporting, and short stories.

High School and Middle School Student Body

Open to all middle and high school students interested in being involved in extra-curricular activities, student government, community and fund-raising events.

High School Social Studies Instructional Workshop

Open to all high school students. This instructional workshop is designed to provide instruction and guidance to students currently enrolled in: World Geography, World History, U.S. History, U.S. Government, Economics, Psychology and Sociology. Both individual instruction and group projects will help students better grasp the social studies curriculum in a small setting. There is a focus on common core standards and cross curricular activities. Students will also be presented with "real world" connections.

High School English Instructional Workshop

Open to all high school students enrolled in English. This instructional workshop will focus on traditional essay writing, proper citations and formatting for research papers. There will be small reading groups to discuss assigned novels and readings. There is a focus on common core standards and cross curricular activities.

High School Science Tutoring

Individual and small-group drop in tutoring. Although open to all high school students, this tutoring focuses primarily on Chemistry.
