Brookside Discovery Kindergarten, Kindergarten and First grade students have been getting lessons on composting from Debra Leith, OPUSD's School Garden Specialist. Tables with compost samples on paper plates were set up in the quad for students to explore the newly made soil and decomposer creatures after Mrs. Leith talked to them about natures way of recycling natural plant materials including kitchen scraps and garden waste. These lessons are the introduction to gardening education aligned to Next Generation Science Standards for upper grade students, where composting education also features the nitrogen and carbon cycles, and plant use of potassium and phosphorus. Our garden raised beds are temporarily located in back of the third grade portable classrooms where students grow fruits and vegetables that are used in school lunches.

Caring For Our Oceans: Earth Week Thank You!

"Caring for Our Oceans" was the theme for the EEAC's Celebration of Earth Week this year. Students learned about marine debris and plastics pollution, how it affects our waterways and what they can do to help.

This year our "Social Change" drive supported restoration efforts to help numerous bird species, including the Laysan Albatross, on Midway Atoll, which is part of the Northwest Hawaiian Islands National Marine Sanctuary (FriendsOfMidway.org). First, a huge thank you to all students, parents and teachers for supporting this effort. With your support, we raised over \$4,400 from the three elementary schools, and Brookside families contributed over \$1,300.

The Brookside class that raised the most funds was Mrs. Varju's and Mrs. Koch's 3rd grade class and they have decided to name their albatross chick "Sky." Your generous donations will

surely be put to good use to help all of the birds on Midway Atoll. You can check out a live bird cam of similar birds located on Kauai <u>here</u>.

Summer Reading Program

School will soon be out for the summer, which means there will be plenty of time for reading. Ventura County Library would like to invite our students to participate in Summer Reading 2018, "Reading Takes You Everywhere" from June 1st through August 4th. The benefits to students of summer reading are clear and libraries are part of the solution.

Young people experience learning losses when they do not engage in educational activities during the summer. Those who do not read over the summer can lose up to 2 months of learning by the time they return to school in the fall, referred to as "summer slide."
