

For over 25 years, Advanced Peer Counseling has been dedicated to providing support to students. Oak Park High School has been designated a "No Place for Hate" school, in which we strive to provide a model for combating intolerance, bullying and hatred. Advanced Peer Counselors have been trained by the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) to offer guidance, understanding, and compassion to our peers. Our goal is to foster a culture of inclusion, acceptance, and awareness on our campus. We are constantly seeking avenues and opportunities that allow us to view the world through a lens that is meaningful and authentic. We believe in the ability to create positive peer empowerment so that all students can succeed in their high school life.



Awareness Week

Awareness Week is an annual, school wide event dedicated to promoting a greater sense of acceptance and awareness on a variety of issues. Each year, Advanced Peer Counselors develop a specific theme that focuses on creating a better understanding among one another. Classroom presentations, special speakers art/writing/multimedia contests, lunch and after school activities and community outreach are all part of this week long experience.



Becoming an Advanced Peer Counselor
