## Early Decision Self-Evaluation Questionnaire\*

Answer the following questions to decide whether or not to apply early to a particular school. If you answer yes to every question, consider applying ED. If you answer one or more questions with a no, consider applying EA or regular decision.

Have I visited this college while classes are in session and met with someone at the admissions office?		
Have I explored my academic, extracurricular, and social options at this college?		
Have I talked with a financial aid officer to get an estimate of college costs and to find out how early decision could affect my aid package?		
Have I discussed this decision with my family and guidance counselor?		
Is this a true first choice, or do other colleges still interest me?

Pros	Cons		
• Bypass regular spring notification deadline	• Must make serious decision before exploring all options		
<ul> <li>Avoid cost of submitting multiple applications</li> <li>Reduce time spent waiting for a decision</li> <li>Have to deal with less stress if accepted</li> <li>May increase chances of getting into top schools and greatly increase chances of getting into less selective schools</li> <li>May get financial aid bonus for applying early</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Can only apply to one school</li> <li>May not have time or opportunity to compare financial aid packages</li> <li>May have no or fewer aid options and few scholarship options</li> <li>Sometimes compete with a smaller but much stronger pool of candidates than during the regular application period</li> <li>If rejected, may feel disappointed and discouraged</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Do</li> <li>Withdraw all applications upon being accepted</li> <li>Request a release from your contract only if the college is unable to work out appropriate financial aid</li> <li>Take your Early Decision seriously</li> <li>Discuss the cost of the college before applying</li> <li>Attend the college that accepts you</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Don't</li> <li>Apply to ED programs at more than one college</li> <li>Have your counselor send transcripts to more than one ED school or to any other schools once admitted</li> <li>Try to get out of an ED acceptance because you've changed your mind</li> <li>Have someone else write or heavily edit your application essays</li> <li>Submit deposits to more than one college</li> <li>State an intended major you don't plan on pursuing because you think it might help you get admitted</li> <li>Inaccurately describe your activities and accomplishments</li> </ul>
