# CLASS OF 2003 EXIT SURVEY STATISTICAL SUMMARY

## **SENIOR OVERVIEW:**

- Out of a total of 238 graduating seniors, 152 reported that they had been accepted to at least one four-year college/university. This is 63.86% of the senior class.
- A total of 140 are attending four-year colleges/universities, or 58.82% of the senior class.
- A total of 91 are attending junior/community colleges, or 38.23% of the senior class.
- A total of 227 are attending four-year colleges/universities or junior colleges, this is 95.37% of the senior class.
- 4 students plan to work full time; 7 will be attending a trade school. The total for this group is 11, which represents 4.62% of the senior class.
- A total of 180 (of those attending either four-year colleges/universities or junior colleges), are staying in California, this is 75.63% of the senior class.
- A total of 35 (of those attending either four-year colleges/universities or junior colleges), are planning to attend school out-of-state, this is 14.70% of the senior class.

### **COLLEGE PREPARATORY STATUS:**

- 198 students reported that they had completed the UC "a-g" course pattern, or 83.19% of the senior class.
- 20 students reported that they had not completed the UC "a-g" course pattern, or 8.40% of the senior class.

## FOUR -YEAR COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY BREAKDOWN:

- 46 students are attending UC schools, or 19.74% of the senior class.
- 26 students are attending CSU schools, or 10.92% of the senior class.
- 86 students reported that they had been accepted by at least one UC School, or 36.13% of the senior class.

#### **Private Schools**

39 students are attending private schools (both California and out-of-state), or 16.38% of the senior class.

#### **Public Schools**

88 students are attending public schools (both California and out-of-state), or 36.97% of the senior class.

## **California Schools**

100 students are attending California schools (both public and private), or 42.01% of the senior class.

#### **Out-of-state Schools**

• 35 students are attending out of state schools (both public and private), or 14.70% of the senior class.

# JUNIOR/COMMUNITY COLLEGE BREAKDOWN:

- 90 students are attending California community colleges, or 37.81% of the senior class.
- 1 student is attending an out-of-state junior/community college, or .042% of the senior class.
- 66 students reported that they had completed the UC "a-g" course pattern, but still chose to attend a junior/community college. This is 27.73% of the senior class.
- 16 students reported that they had been accepted to at least one four-year school, but still chose to attend a junior/community college. This is 6.72% of the senior class.
