


Registration Requirements

All registrations for students in the Discovery Kindergarten Program require that the following forms & documents be brought with you to registration:

- Certified copy of your child's birth certificate.
- Copy of immunization record.
- Proof of residency (Three of the following) 1. Escrow, rental or lease papers 2. Utility bill (not telephone) 3. Driver's License or vehicle insurance with name and address.
- An approved District of Choice Transfer Application form for attendance if you are not an Oak Park resident contact Linda Gam 818\735-3253.
- You will be asked to complete the district General Enrollment form located at the school site.
- You will be asked to complete the Notice of Possible Reassignment form located at the school site.
- You will be asked to complete the Declaration of Residency form located at the school site.
- You will be asked to complete the Home Language Survey located at the school site.
- You will be asked to complete the Pupil Health Record.

The Program: This program was implemented in the fall of 2009. It is open to children who turn 5 between September 1 and December 2 in the school year. Students with earlier summer birthdays may be admitted if room allows. Discovery Kindergarten will expose students to a modified Kindergarten curriculum that is age and developmentally appropriate. At the conclusion of the year, students will enter a traditional Kindergarten program.



Students will have the opportunity to learn and practice important social and communication skills. They will have a chance to learn and express themselves at a pace that is not quite so hurried.

- ◆ The Discovery Program is located at all elementary school sites.
- ◆ The program will be developmental and hands-on so that students can grow at their own pace.



- ◆ The children will receive progress reports three times a year.

The Community and School District: The Oak Park Unified School District is located in a suburban community of eastern Ventura County adjacent to



Los Angeles County. The district was formed in 1978 and currently serves approximately 4600 students in grades DK-12.
