### COURSE EXPECTATIONS...NINTH GRADE SOCIAL SCIENCE

The purpose of Oak Park's freshman social science curriculum is to provide students the means to explore the world of geography and cultures, both near and far. Through these opportunities, students are able to gain a better understanding of the world around them. The expectations of the course are high, but <u>fair and extremely attainable</u>. Students are challenged to <u>engage</u>, and <u>explore</u>, to <u>strive</u>, and <u>achieve</u>...if <u>risks</u> are taken, gains <u>WILL</u> be made! "Our World: A Geographic Investigation" is a course that invites, encourages, and prompts personal involvement...what are you prepared to do...to make a difference in <u>YOUR</u> world? - \* awareness and respect of "the diversity of the world out there"

<u>Positive</u> involvement in class and group activities helps to create successful students, as does being prepared, motivated, and respectful of oneself and others. Encouragement, support, and assistance from home are an <u>invaluable</u> asset to each student. An extensive video library has been developed to enhance the course, as well as to reflect current areas of world focus. These 'glimpses' into regional geography and culture are used to support and deepen student understanding and awareness of various curricular areas...an introduction to the realities, opportunities, and challenges of life outside of Oak Park, California, and the United States.

- Unit "2"... An overview of *The United Nations* including: origins, purpose, structure, strengths/weaknesses, and potential future.
- Unit 3... The physical and cultural geography of Latin America and the Caribbean.
- Unit 6... The physical and cultural geography of North Africa and the Middle East {Southwest Asia}.
- Unit 7... The physical and cultural geography of Africa South of the Sahara (Sub-Saharan Africa).
- Unit 9... The physical and cultural geography of China and the Far East.
- Unit 11... The physical and cultural geography of The Pacific World: Australia, Antarctica, and Oceania.

The provided unit calendars reinforce reading schedules, due dates, and test/quiz dates and therefore, upon return from absence, students should expect to complete <u>ALL</u> assessments, as scheduled. Students have <u>ONE</u> class period after an assigned due date to turn in "late" work to receive 50% of the <u>earned</u> credit... after that time, the assignment will not be accepted.

Students returning from absence will be provided a personalized accounting of work missed and subsequent due dates. However, it will be the RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STUDENT to make sure all makeup work is completed/turned in <u>as required</u>. Additionally, those students who are involved in extracurricular activities need to be <u>very aware</u> of scheduled assessment and due dates that will be missed. It is the responsibility of the student to make alternate arrangements <u>IN ADVANCE</u>, <u>BEFORE</u>
