## Here's what we will work together to explore, understand, and be able to do in this unit:

- 1. Identify and describe the major landforms and water features of the earth.
- 2. Locate and label the world's major physical features.
- 3. Define and apply the five themes of geography.
- 4. Analyze the importance of the grid system of latitude and longitude and display skill in using it.
- 5. Explain how geographers use the elements of geography to study the earth.
- Locate and identify, on the state map, the main agricultural areas of California, as well as specific cities found within the state.



- 7. Describe California's growth into a major agricultural region and how this importance is connected to dependence on water.
- 8. Recognize, describe, and identify on the state map, the general location of California's main geomorphic regions, as well as specific landforms of the state.
- 9. Compare and contrast the factors that have contributed to cultural contacts and cultural barriers.
- 10. Describe the factors that affect the importance of natural resources, compare and contrast renewable and nonrenewable resources, and analyze the ways in which the distribution of resources affects individual people and whole countries.
- 11. Define and accurately apply "world terms."
