## Here's what we will work together to explore, understand, and be able to do in this unit:

- 1. Locate, label, and identify, on a regional map, the main physical, political, and man-made features of The Pacific World. (See cartography application activity = 'regional mapping' = for specific requirements)
- 2. Compare the major landforms of the Pacific World, describe the major climate zones and major natural resources of the region.
- 3. Identify and describe the ways in which geographic factors have worked to shape cultural development in Oceania (the South Pacific).
- 4. Describe the factors that have influenced culture in the region, identify major religions in the region, and explain the various influences on the arts of the region.
- 5. Identify the role of Great Britain in the colonization of both Australia and New Zealand.
- 6. Explain why Oceania (the South Pacific) became the scene of a struggle for colonial control among Western powers during the late 1800's and the early 1900's.
- 7. Evaluate the significance of the region following World War I and during World War II.
- 8. Describe the factors that have influenced standards of living in the region.
- 9. Discuss how the great distances that separate countries in the Pacific World from one another and from other world markets have greatly affected overseas trade, as well as analyzing reasons for economic interdependence within the region.
  - Explain why the environment of Antarctica has remained unspoiled, while analyzing the reasons many of the world's nations are interested in Antarctica and evaluate the actions that have been taken by nations to resolve the issues related to Antarctica's future.
- 11. Identify and explain the "critical issues" challenging the region of the Pacific World.
