## "Africa South of the Sahara" {Sub-Saharan Africa}



## Here's what we will work together to explore, understand, and be able to do in this unit:

- 1. Locate, label, and identify, on a regional map, the main physical and political features of 'Africa South of the Sahara'.
  - (See cartography application activity = 'regional mapping' = for specific requirements)
- 2. Describe the geographic characteristics of Africa South of the Sahara.
- 3. Evaluate the various resources found in the region and discuss the importance of trade for the early kingdoms of Africa South of the Sahara.
- 4. Assess the effects of the slave trade on the history of Sub-Saharan Africa.
- 5. Define oral history and explain why it was such a strong tradition among many of the societies of Africa South of the Sahara.
- 6. Discuss why European countries were so interested in acquiring colonies in Sub-Saharan Africa during the 19th century.
- 7. Explain the purpose of the Berlin Conference of 1884 and analyze the lasting impacts of this event on Africa.
- 8. Evaluate the ethnic, cultural, and religious diversity found throughout the region of Sub-Saharan Africa.
- 9. Discuss the main ways people of the region make a living, the types of transportation and communication facilities available, and the locations where most of the people within the region of Africa South of the Sahara live.
- 10. Analyze one of the most challenging issues within the region-- the conflict over whether to enlarge farming lands or to use available land for preserving the dwindling wildlife populations of Africa.
- 11. Identify and explain the "critical issues" challenging the region of Sub-Saharan Africa.
