g. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 6164.4 – Identification of Individuals For Special Education – First Reading 69

This mandated policy is revised to including notification to parents/guardians regarding their right to consent to the assessment of their child for purposes of determining the child's eligibility for special education or related services.

h. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 6161.1 – Selection and Evaluation of Instructional Materials – First Reading

Policy revised to reflect new law AB 2211 which revised the definition of "sufficiency of instructional materials" to include materials in a digital format as long as specified conditions are met.

i. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 6011 – Academic Standards – First Reading 79

Policy revised to reflect State Board of Education's adoption of Common Core Standards, a set of national voluntary standards in English language arts and mathematics. Policy also add language regarding (1) involvement of representations of business and postsecondary institutions in the recommendation of district standards; (2) alignment of standards with graduation requirements, college entrance requirement, and other student outcomes; and (3) review of standards in response to changing student needs.
