ISSUE:		Shall the Board of Education approve the establishment of a new Discovery Kindergarten Program for the Oak Park District?			
BACKGROUND:		This program is proposed to begin in the fall of 2009. It will be open to children who turn 5 between July 1 and December 2 in the school year. Instead of sending a child straight to kindergarten, parents can choose to place them in a "junior kindergarten" program if they think their child may not be ready for a traditional class. Discovery Kindergarten will expose students to kindergarten standards and curriculum but at a different pace. Students would be introduced to the curriculum but would not be expected to master it. At the conclusion of the year, the young pupils may either enter a traditional kindergarten program or in some cases, advance to first grade. The program will be very developmental and hands-on so that students can grow at their own pace. Students will have the opportunity to learn and practice important social and communication skills. They will have a chance to learn and express themselves at a pace that is not quite so hurried. The children will receive grade reports three times a year so that there are constant updates on their progress. The proposed site will be Red Oak Elementary
