- b. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 5137 Positive School Climate 2nd Reading 47 This policy adds material addressing the link between positive school climate and student learning, staff's responsibility tot serve as positive role models and to manage the classroom effectively, enforcement of rules for student conduct, and the provision of character education.
- c. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 6145.5 Student Organizations and Equal Access Second Reading 51

This policy is updated to clarify distinction between curriculum-related and non-curriculum-related student groups. Material formerly in regulation re: equal access requirements for non-curriculum-related groups moved to policy.

d. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 6178.1 – Work Experience Education – Second Reading 55

This policy is updated to clarify its use for districts with middle and high schools, expands materials on program goals, and requires integrated efforts of teachers, counselors, students, parents/guardians, and employers.

- e. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 9320 Meetings and Notices Second Reading 59 This mandated bylaw is revised to reflect new law (SB 343) which requires meeting notices and agenda to specify the location where members of the public an inspect documents that have been distributed to the Board less than 72 hours before a meeting. Bylaw also modified to reflect new law (AB14) which clarifies that a Board meeting may not be held in a facility that does not allow the admittance of a person on the basis of a protected category of discrimination.
- f. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 9322–Agenda/Meeting Materials–2nd Reading 67 This mandated bylaw is revised to reflect new law (SB 343) which requires the agenda to specify the location where the public can inspect supporting agenda documents that have been distributed to the Board less than 72 hours before the meeting. Bylaw reorganized to create separate sections detailing dissemination of the agenda to the Board and dissemination to members of the public to include the public's right to inspect public record agenda documents that have been distributed less than 72 hours before the meeting, as added by SB 343.
- g. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 3511.2 Waste Management and Environmental Purchasing Procedures Second Reading 73
 This policy is being revised to reflect establishment of Environmental Education and Awareness Committee and more aggressive recycling procedures.
- h. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 6173.1 Education For Foster Youth First Reading

 This policy is revised to require the Superintendent to appoint a district ligison for foster

This policy is revised to require the Superintendent to appoint a district liaison for foster youth; to require training to staff regarding the enrollment, placement, and rights of foster youth; and to require collaboration with other local agencies providing services to foster youth.

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i. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 0200 – Goals For the School District – First Reading

This policy is revised to focus on the Board's role in monitoring this district's progress in achieving its goals for student achievement, including the use of data, performance indicators, and other benchmarks.

j. Approve Amendment of Board Policy 1020 – Youth Services – First Reading
This policy is revised to address the Board's participation in collaborative relationships with city and county elected officials, and local agencies, expands language regarding needs assessment and program evaluation
