### **Tobacco-Free Schools**

The Governing Board recognizes *that* the health hazards associated with smoking and the use of tobacco products, including the breathing of second-hand smoke, *are inconsistent with its goal* and desires to provide a healthy environment for students and staff.

The Board prohibits the use of tobacco products at any time in district-owned or lease buildings, on district property, and in district vehicles. (Health and Safety Code 104420; Labor Code 6404.5; 20 USC 6083)

This prohibition applies to all employees, students, and visitors at any school-sponsored instructional program, activity, or athletic event held on or off district property. Any written joint use agreement governing community use of district facilities or grounds shall include notice of the district's tobacco-free schools policy and consequences for violations of the policy.

Prohibited products include any product containing tobacco or nicotine, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew, clove cigarettes, betel, and nicotine delivery devices such as electronic cigarettes. Exceptions may be made for the use or possession of prescription nicotine products.

The Board prohibits the use of tobacco products at any time in district owned or leased buildings, on district property and in district vehicles. (Health and Safety Code 104420; Labor Code 6404.5; 20 USC 6083)

This prohibition applies to all employees, students and visitors at any instructional program, activity or athletic event.

Smoking or use of any tobacco-related products and disposal of any tobacco-related waste are prohibited within 25 feet of any playground, except on a public sidewalk located within 25 feet of the playground. (Health and Safety Code 104495)

### **Employee Security**

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe, orderly working environment for all employees. As part of the district's comprehensive school safety plan, the Superintendent or designee shall develop strategies for protecting employees from potentially dangerous persons and situations and for *providing* assisting them with the necessary assistance and support when in the event of an emergency situations occur.

Any employee against whom violence or any threat of violence has been directed in the workplace shall notify the Superintendent or designee immediately. The Superintendent or designee shall initiate legal and security measures to protect the employee and others in the workplace. In addition, the Superintendent or designee may initiate legal proceedings against any individual to recover damages for injury caused by the willful misconduct of that individual to the person or property of an employee or another person on district premises. When violence is directed against an employee by any individual and the employee so notifies the Superintendent or designee, the Superintendent or designee shall take steps to ensure that appropriate legal measures are instituted. When the employee notifies the Superintendent or designee of a threat of bodily harm, the district shall take appropriate measures to enable the employee to request assistance if a threat occurs on school grounds.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that employees are trained in crisis prevention and intervention techniques in order to protect themselves and students. Staff development may include training in classroom management, effective communication techniques and crisis resolution.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that employees are informed, in accordance with law, regarding crimes and offenses by students who may pose a danger in the classroom.

The Superintendent or designee may make available at appropriate locations, including, but not limited to, district and school offices, gyms, and classrooms, Board recognizes that access to two-way communications devices that would allows two-way communication with-employees to eall for assistance from their supervisor or law enforcement and others when emergencies occur. in the event of a threat of violence or medical emergency. The district shall provide such communications devices in classrooms to the extent possible.

### Use of Pepper Spray

Employees may not carry or possess pepper spray on school property or at school activities. On a case-by-case basis, however, the Superintendent or designee may allow *an employee to possess* the possession of a pepper spray weapon that meets the requirements of Penal Code 12403.7 when justified by unusual dangerous circumstances. Any employee who is negligent or careless in the possession or handling of pepper spray shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary measures.

### Reporting of Injurious Objects

The Board requires school employees to take immediate action upon being made aware that any person is in possession of an *unauthorized* injurious object on school grounds or at a school-related or school-sponsored activity. The employee shall use his/her own judgment as to the *potential* dangerousness of the situation and *involved and*, based upon this analysis, shall do one of the following:

- 1. Confiscate the object and deliver it to the principal immediately
- 2. Immediately notify the principal, who shall take appropriate action
- 3. Immediately notify the local law enforcement agency call 911 and the principal

### Tobacco

The Governing Board recognizes that tobacco use presents serious health risks and desires to provide support and assistance in reducing the number of students who begin or continue to use tobacco. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a comprehensive program that includes consistent enforcement of laws prohibiting tobacco possession and use by students, tobacco-use prevention education, and intervention and cessation activities and/or referrals. the prevention and intervention of tobacco use among youth.

### **Prohibition Against Tobacco Use**

Prohibited products include, but are not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets, and betel. (Education Code 48900, 48901)

### Program Planning

The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate with the local health department and county office of education in program planning and implementation. He/she may establish an advisory council including students, parents/guardians, district staff, representatives of the local health department and community organizations, law enforcement professional, and/or others with demonstrated expertise in tobacco prevention and cessation.

### Program Evaluation

To evaluate the effectiveness of the district's program and ensure accountability, the Superintendent or designee shall biennially administer the California Healthy Kids Survey or other appropriate student survey at selected grade levels in order to assess student attitudes toward tobacco and student use of tobacco. He/she shall annually report to the Board, and to the CDE if required, the data specified in Health and Safety Code 104450.

When two-thirds of the members present, or if less than two-thirds of the members are present then by a unanimous vote of all members present, determine that the need to take immediate action came to the district's attention after the agenda was posted. The Board determines, either by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present at the meeting or, if less than two-thirds of the members are present, by a unanimous vote of all members present,

### **Challenging Board Actions**

Any interested person or the district attorney's office may present a demand that the Board cure and to-correct a Board action which he/she alleges is in violation of Government Code 54954.2 (agenda posting), Government Code 54953 (open meeting and teleconferencing), Government Code 54954.5 (closed session item descriptions), Government Code 54954.6 (new or increased tax assessments), Government Code 54956 (special meetings), or Government Code 54956.5 (emergency meetings). Any demand to "cure and correct" an alleged violation shall clearly describe the challenged action and the nature of the alleged violation *and* shall be presented to the Board in writing within 90 days of the date when the action was taken. If the alleged violation concerns action taken in an open session but in violation of Government Code 54954.2 (agenda posting), the written demand must be made within 30 days of the date when the alleged action took place. (Government Code 54960.1)

### **Discipline**

Board policies and regulations shall delineate acceptable student conduct and provide the basis for sound disciplinary practices. Each school shall develop disciplinary rules to meet the school's individual needs.

The Oak Park Unified School District supports a "Progressive Discipline Policy" and associated practice because this approach provides a logical, escalating sequence to consequences while informing students and parents at the earliest level where rehabilitation might be employed. An exception for implementing progressive discipline will be for more serious offenses, which require immediate suspension and mandatory expulsion by law.

At all times, the safety of students and staff and the maintenance of an orderly school environment shall be priorities in determining appropriate discipline. When misconduct occurs, staff shall attempt to identify and address the causes of the student's behavior *and* implement appropriate discipline. *Persistently* disruptive students may be assigned to alternative programs or removed from school in accordance with law, Board policy and administrative regulation.

### Library Media Centers

The Governing Board recognizes that school library media centers support the educational program by providing access to a variety of informational resources. The Board desires to provide libraries media centers with up-to-date books, reference materials and electronic information resources necessary to promote literacy, support students in achieving academic standards and encourage *prepare* students to become lifelong learners.

### Classroom Libraries for Grades K-4

When state funding is available for library materials grades K-4 classrooms, the Superintendent or designee shall develop, for certification by the Board, a districtwide classroom library plan grades K-4. Selection and Evaluation of Library Materials

Library materials shall include print and electronic resources that align with the curriculum and are accessible to students with varying cognitive or language needs.

Responsibility for the selection of library materials is delegated to the professional library staff through the principal. School ibrarians shall evaluate and select materials in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation and shall use using professional selection aids and standards, in accordance with law, Board policy and administrative regulation. The selection process shall invite recommendations from administrators, teachers, other staff, parents/guardians and students as appropriate.

- 2. Evaluate and analyze information to determine appropriateness in addressing the scope of inquiry
- 3. Organize, synthesize, create, and communicate information
- 4. Integrate information literacy skills into all areas of learning and pursue information independently to become life-long learners

School librarians also may provide support to teachers, administrators, and other staff by identifying instructional materials that will aid in the development of curriculum and

instructional activities and by providing information about effective and ethical uses of school library services and equipment.

Summertime was a busy time at Oak Hills. The campus looks great with its new playground and landscaping. Our hard-working custodial crew was busy not only cleaning up the campus but also converting our Math/Science room into a new fourth grade classroom, and reconfiguring an office into "Club Math". Our dedicated office staff and PTA volunteers orchestrated a very efficient and successful registration. All families were able to take care of all the necessary paperwork and learn their teacher and classroom assignments. Our new students were welcomed to the Oak Hills community with an orientation including tours of the campus led by Student Ambassadors. These Ambassadors continue to look after our newcomers on the first few days of school so that they have a friendly face during recesses and lunch.

This year we have three new teachers join our Oak Hills team. Last spring, these individuals rose to the top of a very competitive field through a combination of screening, interviews, demonstration lessons, and reference checks. Selecting new staff members is one of the most important things we do, and we are very thankful to our incredible district office staff for all the support that made this process possible. Angela Folendorf has joined us in fifth grade, Emily Trowbridge has joined us in fourth grade, and Kimberly Caffee has taken over our special education program. Ms. Folendorf taught fourth and fifth grade in Long Beach before becoming a trainer for SMART Board technologies. As a leader in professional development, she became well known for her innovative uses of cutting edge technology to maximize student learning. Mrs. Trowbridge taught fourth and fifth grades at a charter school in Culver City, where she also served as a faculty advisor leading professional development for new teachers. She has also assisted with teaching undergraduate and graduate teacher education courses at University of Southern California. Ms. Caffee brings a wealth of experience teaching students with special needs in California's Central Valley. She taught fourth through sixth graders in a special day class setting and ran a Learning Center program for kindergarten through third graders. She also has extensive experience working with a Response to Intervention (RTI) model.

We have three staff members joining our special education team as instructional aides. Sheri Hall and Ellen Grossman are both experienced educators from Brookside Elementary where they excelled in a variety of rolls. We are pleased to have them join our team. Eva Novak is new to our district but brings a variety of experience. Mrs. Novak holds a teaching credential in Montana, where she taught kindergarten. #### REGISTRATION

Thanks to Lori DiGrinis and Bev Futterman, PFC volunteers, and staff, the fall registration went very smoothly. Because of several adjustments to the scheduling processes and procedures, there was less pressure on the guidance office as students adjusted their schedules. Currently, the guidance counselors are busy balancing classes and making minor adjustments to student schedules. Interim freshman counselor, Renan Ahdoot has settled in well and the guidance counselors will very soon begin the senior college application process.

### TEACHERS RETURN

Teachers returned to the news that OPHS has been granted a six-year term of WASC accreditation, news that was well-received and well-deserved. Following the introductions of new staff, the District awards, and a PFC hosted lunch, staff spent an afternoon of professional development that began with a review of the Schoolwires website and included presentations on the incorporating Holocaust and the new SmartBoards. New staff were greeted by their departments and school got off to a very good start.
