# REMARKS FROM BOARD MEMBERS

Member Mary Pallant reported on her tour to Medea Creek Middle School and commended all staff and students on how well everyone works together.

Clerk Megan Lanstman reported on her visit to Medea Creed Middle School and thanked the principal and staff. She reported attending the District of Choice Webinar, the Parenting in an AI World Webinar, the Curriculum Council Meeting where they heard site updates, learned of a course title change, and did a reading for a potential new book for the middle school, and the AI Tech Committee where they reviewed a technology plan. She commended Director of Technology Dana Thompson for running the meeting and coordinating all of the students involved. Megan reported that during the Digital Citizenship Sub-Committee meeting, they researched what other districts are doing in the way of AI in their schools as well as the new state law which will require the integration of AI into curriculum. She expressed her gratitude for the exceptional team working on this subject.

Vice President Jim Moynihan continued Megan's comments on the Digital Citizenship Sub-Committee's meeting. He reported on his tour to Medea Creek Middle School. He reported on the Measure S Committee, stating that they are working to keep a strict budget for the district's facilities. He also stated he attended the play Alice by Heart as well.

President Soyon reported that she visited Medea Creek Middle School and discussed her pride for the students and staff. She reported that they held a Master Schedule discussion for the high school. She also gave an update provided by Assistant Athletic Director Tim Chevalier, stating the football team made it to the playoffs and won their first game, then fell off before the quarter finals, the cross country teams are undefeated thus far, and that girl's volleyball, tennis, and golf teams continue to have league championships.

# REMARKS FROM SUPERINTENDENT

Superintendent Wenn shared that the OPHS held a well attended career fair on October 15th and thanked Ms. Fitz and Ms. Preston and all those who helped coordinate the event, including the parent volunteers. She stated that every site participated in The Great California Shake Out on October 16th at 10:16 am, which gave them the opportunity to identify the strengths and opportunities for betterment of earthquake safety protocols. She attended two Diwali celebrations at MCMS, which she stated was coordinated by parents and was a beautiful display of parents sharing the event with future MCMS families, and at OPHS celebration coordinated by students, which included amazing dancing and fashion. She attended two of the girl's volleyball games and gave compliments to their coach. She reported on the PD day held on October 31st, stated her thanks to Director of Curriculum Ellen Chevalier, discussed the presentation on Mahmoud vs Taylor presented by Ellen Chevalier and Public Communications Officer Ragini Aggarwal, and stated there were collaborative opportunities for teachers at different grade levels.

She reported on her observation an Advanced Peer Counseling class, taught by two counselors Ms Sheret

and Ms Vaboda, and stated comments from the students about what they liked about the high school focussed on the teachers, learning environment, connections they made, inclusivity, wellness center. She discussed that the lesson was taught by two of the students with a focus on recognizing stressors in their lives and how to address them in a healthy way. Lastly, Superintendent Wenn discussed that the Board and herself are finishing the site visits before the holiday begins, completing their goal to visit each site and teacher prior to the end of the first semester. The final site visit will be December 8th. She stated the plan for second semester site visits, starting in February and invited the board to sign up for the site visits they wish to participate in. She thanked the governing board for the site visits, cooperation in the district committees, the effort they put into volunteering, and availability to her, and stated how fortunate she is to have such a wonderful board.
