PROGRAM EVOLUTION

Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE) sponsors many vocational offerings, and OVHS is right at the front of the line

to obtain these opportunities for our students. The program is called Ventura County Innovates (VCI). Beginning August 19, students are taking classes in sound engineering and digital imaging from instructors in the industry. See

This is actually more of a further evolution. All three of our teachers have been extensively trained in project-based instruction, and all staff will continue to develop course work that fosters critical thinking skills and provides for more choice and challenge in daily course work. Ms. Allen will be a trainer for the district in these techniques as part of a cohort of teachers who will replace the outside vendor providing previous professional development. She has also been trained as a peer coach and will serve as such as part of this program.

INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Due to strong success in its opening year, we are continuing with the incentive program at OVHS. Students who have earned perfect attendance, have behaved well at school, and have completed all of their work for the week, are offered the option of spending Friday pursuing their own interests. While opportunities for earning additional credits are offered through VCI classes on Fridays, students can opt to use this time for gaining outlying credits, community service, a job, or a hobby. We Need Help to Keep District of Choice!

Dear Parents and Staff,

The District of Choice (DOC) law is set to expire in June of 2017 and a new bill, SB 1432 was proposed this spring to extend the program well into the future. It passed the State Senate 38-1 and then seemed like it was in trouble when it was sent to the State Assembly Education Committee. OPUSD engaged the services of a lobbyist, along with other school districts who have significant numbers of DOC families and I personally went to Sacramento in June to meet with members of the Committee to explain the importance of the DOC legislation to not only Oak Park, but to public education in California. The bill is currently being held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee's Suspense File, where it will die unless Legislative Leadership understands how vital the District of Choice program is.

This is all happening very quickly. The DOC program is responsible for more than \$18 million in annual funding to the Oak Park USD. If the DOC program ceases to exist, there will be a highly negative impact on ALL of our students, our employees, and community. Additionally, it is not clear what the legal status of the students would be who are attending our schools as part of the DOC program.

It is important that every parent, staff member, and even students, take time **today** and contact three members of the Assembly about the matter. Note that our Assemblymember, Jacqui Irwin is supportive of SB 1432. Simply ask for her help in doing whatever she can to get the bill in front of the Committee.


First Day Team Building



Technology At OVHS

OPUSD is a leader in educational technology and its use in the classroom. OVHS continues to benefit from this, and the evidence is clear in our classrooms and curriculum.

Over the summer, Mrs. Liepman's and Mrs. Kelem's Computer On Wheels (COW) was upgraded with newer Mac laptops. All student computers were upgraded with the latest software.

Teachers work together to fully implement the new district technology standards into our curriculum. We are one of the pilot schools for this in the district.

Mrs. Kelem serves at the school's "techlite," making sure we are all trained on the latest hardware and software available. Ms. Allen represents the school on the district technology committee, tasked with long-range planning and implementation.

Finally, all 3 teachers are using Google Classroom this year and will continue to integrate the use of Google docs into the curriculum. Our Computers class offers Microsoft certification in Word as an option for all students.



Every Thursday during period 6, staff and students shake the dust off and change things up. Mrs. Liepman will take a group of stu-




Awards

Regularly staff members hand out both AAA (Triple A) and Step Up Awards to students who have earned them.

AAA Award — This is a teacher-given classroom award for the student in who has the best attitude, attendance, and achievement. Sometimes, it is given to a student who has had the most improvement in one or more of those areas. These awards are given approximately twice per quarter in all classes. Students earn a certificate, a treat, and a congratulatory speech in front of their peers in the classroom.

Step Up Award — This award is given to students who have stepped up in some way. It can be for mastering a personal challenge such as getting to school on time every day or getting a job or taking the SAT. It could be given by a staff member for exemplary behavior or personal growth evidenced in or out of the classroom. They are awarded in front of all peers at a Check Out Assembly like the one pictured on page 2.
