

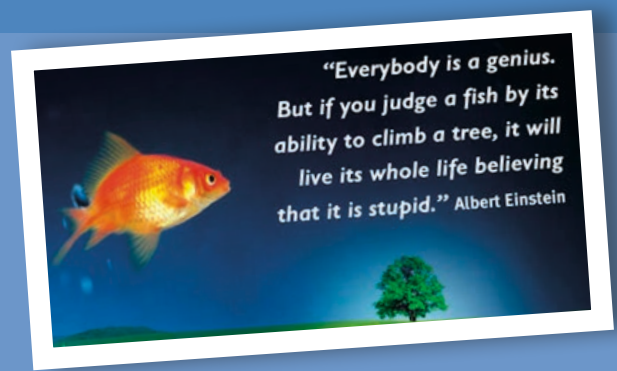
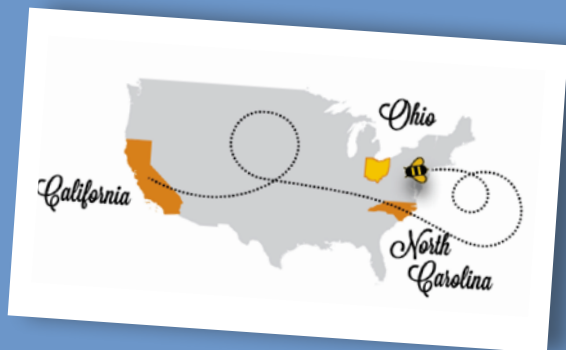

EARTH WEEK IN OAK PARK SCHOOLS

This year the Environmental Education and Awareness Committee has selected the theme of Beneficial Bugs to focus our Earth Week activities on. Beneficial Bugs are insects that help our food grow by eating pests on plants to eliminate pesticide use and pollinating them at the same time. We will be focusing our education on ladybugs for K-2 and honeybees for 3-5. Ladybugs love to eat pests like aphids and help fight plant disease. Bees pollinate 75% of food crops in the US. We can thank honeybees for one in every three bites of food we eat.

ALL 3 OAK PARK ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS EARN GOLD RIBBON

Congratulations are in order to Brookside, Oak Hills, and Red Oak Elementary Schools for being selected for the California Gold Ribbon Schools Award this month. Schools applied for the award based on a model program their school has adopted that includes standards-based activities, projects, strategies, and practices that can be replicated by other local educational agencies. The award recognized middle and high schools in 2015.

The Gold Ribbon awards recognize California schools that have made gains in implementing the academic content and performance standards adopted by the State Board of Education. These include the California Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics, California English Language Development Standards, and Next Generation Science Standards.

Each school had to select a 'Model Program/Practice' in addition to demonstrating overall excellence. Each school selected a different aspect of our work toward implementation of the New California Standards (Common Core).

OAK PARK HIGH SCHOOL ROCKET TEAM MAKES IT TO THE NATIONAL FINALS



The Oak Park High School Rocket Team has qualified to compete in the national finals of the 14th annual Team America Rocketry Challenge (TARC). The team will face 99 of the top rocketry teams from across the country to claim the title of national champion. The TARC Final Fly-Off will take place May 14 at Great Meadow in The Plains, V.A., outside of Washington, D.C. On Friday, May 13, the team will display their rocket at a Congressional Reception on Capitol Hill. TARC is the aerospace and defense industry's flagship program designed to encourage students to pursue study and careers in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). Sponsored by the Aerospace Industries Association, the National Association of Rocketry, NASA, and the U.S. Dept. of Defense, and more than 20 industry partners, TARC is the world's largest rocket contest. Now in its fourteenth year, TARC has inspired more than 60,000 middle and high school students to explore education and careers in STEM fields. This year, 789 teams representing all 50 states, the District of Columbia and the U.S. Virgin Islands designed and built model rockets in hopes of qualifying for the National Finals.

This is the second time Oak Park's team has made it to the National Finals. In 2012, the team finished 17th in the United States and then was invited to participate in the NASA Student Launch Initiative the following year, where they built a large 11-foot rocket that was launched from the NASA Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, AL. Those students are now juniors in college and attending some of the most prestigious universities in the U.S.

ODYSSEY OF THE MIND

Oak Park is in its second year of competing in the Odyssey of the Mind tournaments and doing quite successfully in terms of placing in the tournament but also in teaching creativity and problem solving to students. The Odyssey of the Mind teaches students to learn creative problem-solving methods while having fun in the process. For more than twenty-five years, this unique program has helped teachers generate excitement in their students. By tapping into creativity, and through encouraging imaginative paths to problem solving, students learn skills that will provide them with the ability to solve problems — great and small — for a lifetime. The Odyssey of the Mind teaches students how to think divergently by providing open-ended problems that appeal to a wide range of interests. Students learn how to identify challenges and to think creatively to solve those problems. They are free to express their ideas and suggestions without fear of criticism.



The creative problem-solving process rewards thinking "outside of the box." While conventional thinking has an important place in a well-rounded education, students need to learn how to think creatively and productively.

This tournament season we had 9 teams in our district, 5 at Medea and 5 at the elementary schools,

that all were finishers at the regional tournament. That is the greatest success of all, to successfully complete the challenge. Four of those teams advanced to state and one of the Medea teams placed third at the state level. This is the second year for this team who also went to state last year. MEASURE C PARCEL TAX INFORMATION

The Oak Park Unified School District is accepting requests for Senior Exemptions for the Measure C Parcel Tax. Senior citizens 65 years old or older, or anyone turning 65 during 2016, who live in their home in Oak Park may go to the District's Support Services Office at 5801 E. Conifer Street, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to get an exemption form, or you may call to request a form be mailed to you by calling 818-735-3206.

Seniors must bring to the Oak Park Unified School District Support Services Office the completed and signed form along with your 2015-2016 tax assessment bill with parcel number and address shown and proof of your age. Accepted forms of proof of age are drivers license/State I.D. card, passport or birth certificate. This must be your primary residence; rental properties are not eligible for exemption. All exemptions must be submitted and verified by June 4, 2016. This exemption must be renewed annually in order to maintain eligibility.
