PROPOSED BELL SCHEDULE FOR 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEARS**  
INFORMATION/DISCUSSION

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**ISSUE:** Shall the Board discuss the Oak Park High School proposed bell scheduled for the 2022-2023 school year?

**BACKGROUND:** Senate Bill (SB) 328 requires that high schools, by July 1, 2022, begin school no earlier than 8:30 AM. Currently, the Oak Park High School day begins at 7:20 AM with zero period and 8:30 AM for Block 1/2. The changes mandated by SB 328 results in changes to the way instructional minutes are counted for the school and for individual students. Under SB 328, instructional minutes for zero period if it begins before 8:30 AM cannot be counted. This requires a change in the Oak Park High School bell schedule since currently the zero period minutes are being counted in the overall instructional minutes for the school and students.

In order to comply with the requirement of SB 328, Oak Park High School has engaged with staff, students, families, and district administration to revise the bell schedule to meet the unique needs of the school community. Site administration has prepared the following presentation to inform the Board and the community regarding the proposed bell schedule.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** None

**BOARD POLICY:** Pursuant to BP 6112 School Day - The Board encourages flexibility in scheduling so as to provide longer time blocks or class periods when appropriate and desirable to support student learning, provide more intensive study of core academic subjects or extended exploration of complex topics, and reduce transition time between classes.

**GOAL:** In support of OPUSD Goal - 2. Strengthen the Climate of Care and School Connectedness at all OPUSD schools.

# Senate Bill (SB) 328

- Signed by Governor in 2019
- Goes into effect July 1, 2022
- Based on decades of research on teen health, sleep patterns, and brain chemistry
- Basic requirements
  - High schools shall begin no earlier than 8:30 AM
  - Middle schools shall begin no earlier than 8:00 AM
  - Implementation shall begin no later than July 1, 2022
  - Adds CA Education Code 46148



# Required Instructional Minutes

- Schoolwide annual = 64,800 instructional minutes
- Student = avg. 240 instructional minutes over a block cycle (2 days)
  - No day below 180 instructional minutes
- Under SB 328, 0 & 8th period minutes no longer count toward the schoolwide annual or student instructional minutes
  - 0 and 8th period will still be offered to students
  - 0 and 8th period will count toward A-G requirements and GPA



# Bell Schedule Process Timeline

November 30, 2021 - Met with faculty representatives

December 8, 2021 - Met with faculty, student, and parent representatives, site admin., district admin.

December 10, 2021 - Met with site admin and district admin.

December 10, 2021 - District admin. met with auditor

December 17, 2021 - Met with faculty, student, and parent representatives, site adm., district admin., legal representative, regional union representative

December 21, 2021 - Met with faculty, student, and parent representatives, site admin., district admin.

January 5, 2022 - Presented to Staff via email

January 10, 2022 - Presented to Staff virtual staff meeting

January 18, 2022 - Board and Public presentation and discussion of the various options being considered

January 20 & 21, 2022 - Faculty (OPTA) voted on four options. The option included is the most preferred.

January 24, 2022 - Site admin and OPTA representatives met

January 26, 2022 - Met with OPTA representatives, site admin., district admin., legal representative

January 31, 2022 - Student information session at lunch and family webinar in the evening

February 1 & 2, 2022 - Faculty (OPTA) voted; 62 % of the full staff voted affirmatively for this schedule

February 4, 2022 - Communication and FAQs sent out to all families/staff

February 9, 2022 - Proposed Bell Schedule Presentation to the Board and Public



# What does this mean for Oak Park High School?

- Start at 8:30 AM (same as current schedule)
- Proposed dismissal at 3:29 PM (current is 3:10 PM for 7th Period)
  - Instructional support minutes built into longer blocks each period
  - 8th period still offered (start at 3:30 PM)

\*Since 0 period minutes will no longer count toward the schoolwide annual instructional minutes, these minutes needed to be added into the schedule resulting in a later end time.

# Goals of Proposed New Schedule

- Comply with SB 328
- Minimize disruption to existing schedules and instructional practices where possible
- Offer support to students within the school day



# Advantages of Proposed New Schedule

- Closest to the current OPHS bell schedule; easiest transition for students and staff
- Zero period will continue to be offered
- Eighth period will continue to be offered
- We currently don't have athletic practices during the 7th period. 7th period currently ends at 3:10 PM. The new dismissal time will be 3:29 PM, which only moves the start of practices ~20 minutes.



# Advantages of Proposed New Schedule

- We have a long history of block scheduled classes; this is not a new instructional model and thus should not be a huge adjustment since the extra time is for student support (individual help, work on homework, study for tests)
- Could lead to more family time for students/families if homework and studying is done at school
- All students will now have access to support time
  - 69 minutes per day = 23 hours per month



# Concerns of New Proposed Schedule

- Extended blocks and their impact on student learning.
  - We will need to do some additional professional development with our teachers on teaching in extended blocks, that have embedded support time for students.
- Timing of extracurricular practices and competitions



# Things to look at for the start of 2022-23 school year

- Start and end times of zero period
- Impact on traffic during pick-up/drop-off time for families with children at multiple sites
- Test make-ups
- Students who do not have an immediate need for built-in support time
- Distinguish between new instruction and support time
  - Use minutes at the start of class to review past material
  - Use the minutes throughout the class to allow more processing, better pacing, more formative assessments
  - Use the minutes for individual circumstances: testing, labs, project presentations
  - Use the minutes, at the end, to allow students to get started on homework
  - Use the minutes, at the end, to provide individual help or time to make-up quizzes, etc.
- Possibility of scheduling some additional sports during the 5/6 period. This would need to be the sports where we have certificated staff as coaches.



# Summary

- SB 328 requires we change our bell schedule
- 0 period instructional minutes can no longer be used to meet the schoolwide annual or student instructional minutes requirements
- Many bell schedule options were considered
- Proposed bell schedule meets the most priorities and creates the least disruption for OPHS students and staff

**SUBJECT: A.2. AWARD CONTRACT FOR VARSITY SOFTBALL FIELD IMPROVEMENTS AT OAK PARK HIGH SCHOOL**

ACTION

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**ISSUE:** Shall the Board award contract to make improvements to the Oak Park High School Softball Field?

**BACKGROUND:** At the August 17, 2021 meeting, the Board reviewed, amended and approved the 2021-2022 Moral Imperatives and District Goals. Stated in these goals is that the District will “identify and address upgrades/improvements to the athletic fields”. Since this meeting, the District has received feedback from parents/guardians and Oak Park High School (OPHS) staff on needed improvements at the varsity softball field to address safety, functionality, and equity concerns.

District staff have created a plan to address identified concerns, which include this proposed project. The scope of this project includes increasing the fence height to help protect fans from foul balls, expanding the home dugout for functionality, repositioning the first base line fence to allow spectator stands to move closer to the field for visibility, and installing roofs on both the home and visitor dugouts.

Following the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Commission (CUPCAA) guidelines the District solicited two bids for this project. Both bids are included for the Board’s review. Staff is recommended that the Board award the contract to Fence Factory based on design, as well as being the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The cost for the project is \$57,255.33, to be funded by the Restricted General Fund.

**BOARD POLICY:** Pursuant to Board Policy 3312 Contracts - For the contract to be valid or to constitute an enforceable obligation against the district, all contracts must be approved and/or ratified by the Governing Board.

**GOAL:** In Support of OPUSD Goal 5.e. - Identify and address upgrades/improvements to our athletic fields, and the Pavilion. Evaluate and improve equitable access to all school facilities.

**ALTERNATIVES:**

1. Award contract to Fence Factory.
2. Do not award contract.

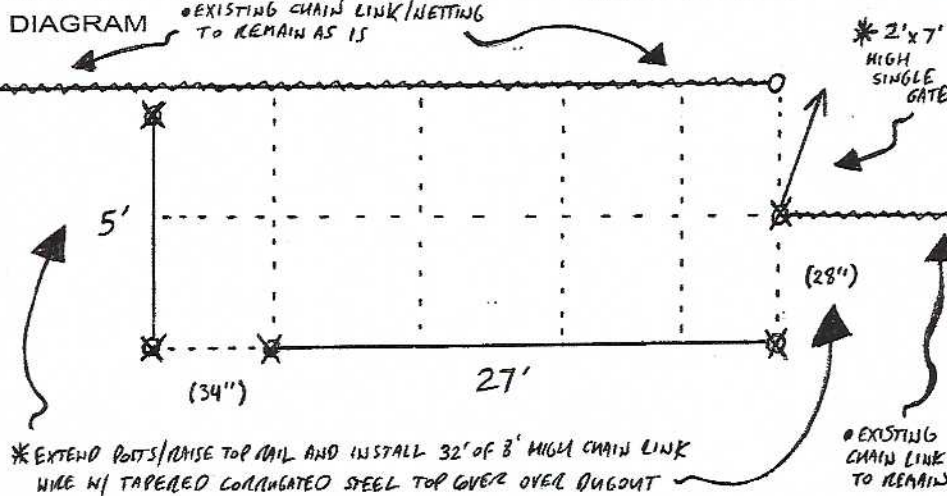
