At the March 19th regular meeting of the OPUSD Board of Education, the Board recognized the OPHS Girls Basketball Team and Coaches on their outstanding performance at CIF and State competitions. The Board heard

- Renewal Agreement for Mandated Cost Program Advisory and Compliance Services

SI&A assists and prepares claims for timely submission to the state controller by working with each school in our District.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

#### **CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

- Approved 2018-19 School Plans for Student Achievement
  - The School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) for each school is developed annually by the School Site Council and is meant to consolidate all school-level planning efforts into one plan for programs funded through the consolidated application (ConApp)
- Approved the <u>District Instructional Calendar for 2020-2021</u>
  - Public Speaker Cathy Lory, a math teacher from Oak Park High School requested the Board to consider the effect of the Calendar with uneven semester and its impact on semester classes at the high school in the future. The board held a discussion and asked Staff to explore different options to see how best to align the calendar to fit the needs of the elementary schools and secondary schools. The Board approved the Calendar as presented since it had received the greatest number of votes from the Oak Park Teachers Association and Oak Park Classified Association.
- Approved Updated Board Policy and New Administrative Regulation 6152.1 Placement in Mathematics Courses, and Review Math Pathways

Board approved the updates to the math placement policy contingent upon seeing at the April Board meeting all documents provided to parents/students from 6th to 12th that notify parents and students of

the District's math placement protocols/pathways, including a link to the where this information is contained on the District's website. The Board also requested staff present data pursuant to Board policy 6152.1(c) including information about (but not limited to): the data on which the math articulation team bases the District's math placement protocols and the percentages of students in each type of math class and the percentages that move on.

Approve Updated Board Policy 6142.92 – Mathematics Instruction
 Board approved the revisions to this policy to be consistent with the revisions made to Board Policy 6152.1 Placement in Mathematics Courses.

# **BUSINESS**

- Approved Acceptance of Donation
  - The Aerojet Rocketdyne Foundation has donated \$1000 to OPHS's Rocket Team. The Board accepted the donations with gratitude.
- Adopted Resolution #19-08, Calling for Full and Fair Funding of California's Public Schools While California lags behind most of the country in public school funding, school districts and county offices of education are facing increased financial pressure from rapidly rising costs. It's time that California ends decades of underinvestment in public schools and provide the resources needed to offer all students a high-quality education. To that end, the Board of Education passed a resolution to urge the State Legislature to fund California's public schools at the national average or higher by the year 2020, and at a level equal to or above the average of the top 10 states by 2025.
- Adopted Resolution #19-09, Calling for Special Education Funding for California's Public Schools

California provides educational services to more than 700,000 children with identified disabilities. While the current amount of funding for students with significant disabilities, such as autism, blindness, deafness or severe orthopedic impairments is far below amounts necessary to support their education the cost of materials, equipment, technology, and/or specialized services necessary for these students far exceed the per-ADA amount provided, with the average costs estimated at \$17,600 and can be as high as \$40,000.

- Discussed 2019 Measure S Bond Priority Projects Plan and Related Funding Issues
   The Board held a discussion based on the information provided by the staff pertaining to the rapid increase in construction costs, coupled with a 4-5 year delay in state School Building Program modernization matching funds, which have significantly and adversely impacted the District's 5-year Measure S Master Plan. The Board recommended holding a study session before the April 23, 2019 meeting to discuss this in more detail, allowing the Measure S Committee to discuss the issue first.
- Tabled the following until a future meeting:
  - Award of Bid, Measure S Project 17-47S, DSA Certification of Administration Building at Brookside Elementary School
  - Agreement for DSA Inspection Services, Measure S Project 17-47S, DSA Certification of Administration Building at Brookside Elementary School
  - Agreement for DSA Test and Inspection Services, Measure S Project 17-47S, DSA Certification of Administration Building at Brookside Elementary School
- Adopted Resolution #19-10, Redeposit Payroll for Tax Deferral on Employee
   Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 414(h)(2) permits employer "pickup" of the employee portion of
   contributions to a retirement plan, thereby resulting in tax deferral of employee contributions; and under
   the (California) State Teachers' Retirement System (CalSTRS) plan conditions, members may be
   allowed to redeposit contributions previously withdrawn plus interest and/or purchase permissive
   service credit.

- Approved Change Order 1, Measure R Project 18-41R, Relocatable Classroom Repairs at Multiple Sites
- Approved Notice of Completion, Measure R Project 18-41R, Relocatable Classroom Repairs at Multiple Sites
- Approved Certification of 2018-19 Second Interim Financial Report and Budget Revisions
   The Board approved a positive certification as the District staff has presented a balanced budget, a 3% reserve for economic uncertainties, and a multiyear projection demonstrating the ability to meet its financial obligations in the current and two subsequent years.
- Adopted Resolution #19-11, Participation in CSBA California School Cash Reserve Program
   TRANs are short-term debt instruments issued by school districts throughout the State to create an
   additional reserve to the general fund. In our District, this reserve will act as a cushion to the general
   fund if we experience temporary cash flow needs due to the withholding of state funds to later in the
   school year.
