NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to Section 5092 of the Education Code of the State of California that due to a vacancy caused by the resignation of Oak Park Unified School District ("OPUSD" or "the District") Board of Education Member Allen Rosen effective January 19, 2022, an appointment pursuant to Education Code Section 5091 will be made.

Any legally qualified citizen of Oak Park who is interested in serving on the OPUSD Board can contact the OPUSD Communications Coordinator and Executive Assistant to the Superintendent/Board at <u>raggarwal@opusd.org</u> or (818) 735-3206 or go online to <u>www.opusd.org/BoardVacancy</u> to obtain the required Candidate Information Sheet and application. To be considered, OPUSD must receive a completed application <u>no later</u> than 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, January 18, 2022. Applications must be submitted by email to raggarwal@opusd.org or in-person to OPUSD, 5801 Conifer Street, Oak Park, CA 91377 (attention: Ragini Aggarwal).

On January 20, 2022, OPUSD Board President, Drew Hazelton, will release and post the list of qualified candidates who will be invited for an interview.

Candidate interviews will take place at a Special meeting of the Board of Education held at Oak Park High School, Presentation Room G9, 899 Kanan Road, Oak Park, California, on Thursday, January 27, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. Members of the public can attend this meeting in person or view it online at <u>www.opusd.org/livestream</u>. At this meeting, the Board of Education will interview candidates and make a provisional appointment to the OPUSD Board. Unless a petition calling for a special election containing a sufficient number of signatures is filed in the office of the Ventura County Superintendent of Schools, 5100 Adolfo Rd, Camarillo, CA 93012 within thirty (30) days of the appointment, this appointment shall become final.

California Education Code 35107 requires that candidates meet the following minimum eligibility requirements to be considered for provisional appointment to the Board:

- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Be a citizen of the state of CA.
- Be a resident of Oak Park.
- Be a registered voter.
- Not be disqualified by the Constitution or laws of the state to hold a civil office.

The Board is responsible for ensuring the District operates effectively and efficiently. Trustees commit a significant amount of time, energy, effort and dedication to ensure that the District can appropriately serve our community. Process and Timeline for Provisional Appointment Oak Park Unified School District Board of Education Trustee

PROCESS FOR PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT

- Within time limits set by law (60 days):
- Advertise the vacancy in the Acorn, social media, on the OPUSD website and via ParentSquare email to families.
- Solicit applications or nominations of any legally qualified citizen interested in serving on the Board.
- To serve on the Board, a person must meet the eligibility requirements specified in Education Code 35107.
- Appoint a committee consisting of less than a quorum of the Board to ensure that applicants are eligible for board membership.
- Provide candidates with appropriate information regarding board member responsibilities.
- Announce names of candidates and accept public input either in writing or at a public board meeting.
- Interview the candidates at a public board meeting.
- Select the provisional appointee by majority vote at a public board meeting.
- The person appointed shall hold office until the next regularly scheduled election for the District Board members and shall be afforded all the powers and duties of a board member upon appointment.
- The next regularly scheduled election for District Board members is November 8, 2022.

Tuesday, November 16, 2021	Board Member Allen Rosen announced as part of his remarks that he will be relocating out of Oak Park and will need to give up his seat on the Board of Education.	
Monday, November 29, 2021	The Superintendent of the Ventura County Office of Education received and filed Mr. Rosen's deferred resignation with an effective date of January 19, 2022. This triggered the 60-day timeline for the Board of Education to (1) order a special election to fill the vacancy; or (2) make a provisional appointment to fill the vacancy.

- Officer asking or receiving bribes (Penal Code §§ 68, 88)
- Receiving gratuity for appointment to office (Pencil Code § 74)
- Judicial Officer who asked for or received emoluments, gratuities, rewards, or the fee of a stenographer (Penal Code § 94)
- Giving or offering bribe to Councilman or Supervisor (Penal Code § 165)
- Misappropriation of public funds (Penal Code§ 424)
- Interface with work or discipline of, or giving certain articles to prisoners (Penal Code § 2772)
- Interference with or giving certain articles to convicts (Penal Code § 2790)

Government and Elections Code Sections:

- Officer making contracts in which he or she is interested (Government Code§ 1097)
- Members of the Legislature convicted of any crime (Government Code § 9055)
- Corrupting the voting process (Election Code§ 18501)

Filling Vacancies

Events Causing a Vacancy

A vacancy on the Governing Board may occur for any of the following events:

1. The death of an incumbent. (Government code 1770)

2. The adjudication pursuant to a quo warranto proceeding declaring that an incumbent is physically or mentally incapacitated due to disease, illness, or accident and that there is reasonable cause to believe that the incumbent will not be able to perform the duties of his/her office for the remainder of his/her term. (Government Code 1770)

3. A Board member's resignation. (Government Code 1779)

A vacancy resulting from resignation occurs when the written resignation is filed with the County Superintendent of Schools having jurisdiction over the district, except where a deferred effective date is specified in the resignation so filed, in which case the resignation shall become operative on that date. A Board member may not defer the effective date of his/her resignation for more than 60 days after he/she files the resignation with the County Superintendent. Upon being filed with the County Superintendent, a written resignation, whether specifying a deferred effective date or otherwise, shall be irrevocable. (Education Code 5090, 5091)

4. A Board member's removal from office, including recall. (Government code 1770; Elections Code 11384)

5. A Board member's ceasing to be a resident of the district. (Government Code 1770)

6. A Board member's absence from the state for more than 60 days, except in the following situations. (Government Code 1064, 1770)

- a. Upon district business with the approval of the Board
- b. With the consent of the Board for an additional period not to exceed a total absence of 90 days

In the case of illness or other urgent necessity, and upon a proper showing thereof, the time limit for absence from the state may be extended by the Board.

c. For federal military deployment, not to exceed an absence of a total of six months, as a

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member of the armed forces of the United States or the California National Guard

If the absence of the Board member for this purpose exceeds six months, the Board may approve an additional six-month absence upon a showing that there is a reasonable expectation that the member will return within the second six-month period, and the Board may appoint an interim member to serve in his/her absence. If two or more members of the Board are absent by reason of these circumstances, and those absences result in the inability to establish a quorum at a regular meeting, the Board may immediately appoint one or more interim members, as necessary to enable the Board to conduct business and discharge its responsibilities. The term of an interim member appointed in these circumstances shall not extend beyond the return of the absent Board member or beyond the next regularly scheduled election for that office, whichever occurs first.

7. A Board member's ceasing to discharge the duties of his/her office for the period of three consecutive months, except when prevented by illness or when absent from the state with the permission required by law. (Government Code 1770)

8. A Board member's conviction of a felony or any offense involving a violation of his/her official duties or conviction of a designated crime resulting in a forfeiture of office. (Government Code 1770 and 3000-3003)

9. A Board member's refusal or neglect to file his/her required oath within the time prescribed. (Government Code 1770)

(cf. 9224 - Oath or Affirmation)

10. The decision of a competent tribunal declaring void a Board member's election or appointment. (Government Code 1770)

11. A Board member's commitment to a hospital or sanitarium as a drug addict, dipsomaniac, inebriate, or stimulant addict-by a court of competent jurisdiction, in which case, the office shall not be deemed vacant until the order of commitment has become final. (Government Code 1770)

12. A "failure to elect" in which no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have filed to run for a Board seat(s) (Education Code 5090, 5326, 5328)

Timelines for Filling a Vacancy

When a vacancy occurs, the Board shall take the following action, as appropriate:

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1. When a vacancy occurs less than four months before the end of a Board member's term, the Board shall take no action. (Education Code 5093)

2. When a vacancy occurs four or more months before the end of a Board member's term, the Board shall, within 60 days of the date of the vacancy or the filing of the member's deferred resignation, either order an election or make a provisional appointment, unless a special election is mandated as described in item #3 below. (Education Code 5091, 5093)

3. When a vacancy occurs from six months to 130 days before a regularly scheduled Board election at which the position is not scheduled to be filled, a special election to fill the position shall be consolidated with the regular election. The person so elected shall take office at the first regularly scheduled Board meeting following the certification of the election and shall serve only until the end of the term of the position which he/she was elected to fill. (Education Code 5093)

Eligibility

In order to be appointed or elected to fill a vacancy on the Board, a person must meet the eligibility requirements specified in Education Code 35107.

(cf. 9220 - Governing Board Elections)

Provisional Appointments

When authorized by law to make a provisional appointment to fill a vacancy on the Board, the Board shall advertise in the local media to solicit candidate applications or nominations. A committee consisting of less than a quorum of the Board shall ensure that applicants are eligible for Board membership and announce the names of the eligible candidates. The Board shall interview the candidates at a public meeting, accept oral or written public input, and select the provisional appointee by a majority vote.

(cf. 9130 - Board Committees) (cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)

Within 10 days after the appointment is made, the Board shall post notices of the actual vacancy, or the filing of a deferred resignation, and the provisional appointment. The notice shall be published in the local newspaper pursuant to Government Code 6061 and posted in at least three public places within the district. (Education Code 5092)

The notice shall contain: (Education Code 5092)

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BB 9223(d)

1. The date of the occurrence of the vacancy or the date of the filing of, and the effective date of, the resignation

2. The full name of the appointee

3. The date of appointment

4. A statement notifying the voters that unless a petition calling for a special election pursuant to Education Code 5091 is filed in the office of the County Superintendent of Schools within 30 days of the provisional appointment, it shall become an effective appointment

The person appointed shall hold office until the next regularly scheduled election for district Board members and shall be afforded all the powers and duties of a Board member upon appointment. (Education Code 5091)

Appointment Due to Failure to Elect

When a vacancy occurs because no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have been nominated (i.e., a failure to elect), and a district election will not be held, the Board shall appoint a qualified person to the office. This appointment shall be made at a meeting prior to the day fixed for the election and the appointee shall be seated at the organizational meeting as if elected at the district election. (Education Code 5328)

(cf. 9100 - Organization)

When an appointment is being made because of a failure to elect, the district shall publish a notice once in a newspaper of general circulation published in the district, or if no such newspaper exists, in a newspaper having general circulation within the district. This notice shall state that the Board intends to make an appointment and shall inform persons of the procedure available for applying for the appointment. (Education Code 5328.5)

The procedure for selecting and interviewing candidates shall be the same as the procedures for "Provisional Appointments," as specified above.

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Bylaws of the Board

E 9223(a)

Filling Vacancies

Events causing vacancy before expiration of term: (Government Code 1770)

An office becomes vacant on the happening of any of the following events before the expiration of the term:

- (a) The death of the incumbent
- (b) The adjudication pursuant to a quo warrant proceeding declaring that the incumbent is physically or mentally incapacitated due to disease, illness or accident and that there is reasonable cause to believe that the incumbent will not be able to perform the duties of his/her office for the remainder of his/her term
- (c) His/her resignation
- (d) His/her removal from office
- (e) His/her ceasing to be an inhabitant of the district for which the officer was chosen or appointed or within which the duties of his/her office are required to be discharged
- (f) His/her absence from the state without the permission required by law beyond the period allowed by law
- (g) His/her ceasing to discharge the duties of his/her office for the period of three consecutive months, except when prevented by sickness or when absent from the state with the permission required by law
- (h) His/her conviction of a felony or any offense involving a violation of his/her official duties. An officer shall be deemed to have been convicted under this subdivision when trial court judgment is entered. For the purposes of this subdivision, "trial court judgment" means a judgment by the trial court either sentencing the officer or otherwise upholding and implementing the plea, verdict or finding.
- (i) His/her refusal or neglect to file his/her required oath or bond within the time prescribed
- (j) The decision of a competent tribunal declaring void his/her election or appointment
- (k) The making of an order vacating his/her office or declaring the office vacant when the officer fails to furnish an additional or supplemental bond

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Bylaws of the Board

 $E\,9223(b)$

(1) His/her commitment to a hospital or sanitarium by a court of competent jurisdiction as a drug addict, dipsomaniac, inebriate or stimulant addict; in this event, the office shall not be deemed vacant until the order of commitment has become final.

Absence from state; members of governing board of school districts; conditions; (Government Code 1064)

No member of the governing board of a school district shall be absent from the state for more than 60 days, except in any of the following situations:

- (a) Upon business of the school district with the approval of the board
- (b) With the consent of the governing board of the school district for an additional period not to exceed a total absence of 90 days
- (c) For federal military deployment not to exceed six months as a member of the armed forces of the United States or the California National Guard

In the case of illness or other urgent necessity, and upon a proper showing thereof, the time limited for absence from the state may be extended by the governing board of the school district for an additional period not to exceed 30 days.
