The Board of Education of the Oak Park Unified School District (OPUSD) invites highly qualified and passionate educational leaders to apply for the position of District Superintendent. SELECTION PROCESS

The Board of Education has retained Consultants Drs. Peggy Lynch and Fred Van Leuven of Leadership Associates to recruit qualified candidates. The consultants will screen applications and recommend candidates to the Board for interviews and further consideration. The Board will have the opportunity to review all applications submitted. Any contact with board members, in an attempt to influence the selection process, will be considered a breach of professional ethics. Finalists will have an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the community and schools. Board members reserve the right to visit the District and communities of a candidate prior to a final decision.

SALARY AND CONTRACT

The salary will be competitive and based upon qualifications and experience. A multi-year contract will be considered.

To be considered, the candidate must provide:

- A letter of application describing how the candidate meets the expectations in this position description
- A resume
- Three professional reference letters
- Verification of degrees and credentials (finalists only)

THE DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Oak Park Unified School District is a high performing public K-12 school district located in Oak Park, an unincorporated community in south Ventura County on the border with Los Angeles County, nestled between the cities of Agoura Hills, Westlake Village, and Thousand Oaks. The school district was formed in 1977 when residents voted to create a new school district to better meet the needs of its residents, beginning a long tradition of placing the highest priority toward ensuring a high quality education.

The comprehensive (grades K-12) public school district serves approximately 4500 students and comprises three elementary schools, a middle school, a high school, as well as an independent school and a continuation school for students with unique needs. Students from the entire region are drawn to attend Oak Park schools with about 40 percent of students coming from neighboring districts via the District of Choice program as well as through inter district transfers and permits.

All of the district's schools are California Gold Ribbon schools and have been nationally recognized as Blue Ribbon schools. The district was named the first US Department of Education Green Ribbon School District in California in 2013 and has also been recognized as a national Green Ribbon school district for its focus on environmentally progressive policies and practices. OPUSD was named an exemplary school district in 2018 and 2019, one of only 22 districts in California.

Oak Park High School, serving approximately 1,450 students in grades 9-12 is nationally recognized for its academic excellence. WASC accredited, OPHS is a National Blue Ribbon School and was named a California Distinguished School in 2019 and a Gold Ribbon School in 2015.

The district motto is: Educating Compassionate and Creative Global Citizens.
