

COURSE INFORMATION & CLASSROOM POLICIES

Welcome! We are happy to be back and are ready for a great year. This year we are going to explore the mathematical world of geometry. Together we will expand your vocabulary and knowledge of the true universal language, math. Geometry is a way of thinking. Be ready to struggle! During this course we practice and develop our reasoning skills by practicing geometric proofs. We will get to learn about geometric terms and the most popular geometric shapes and their properties. However, since we are still learning math you will be expected to practice and use your algebraic skills on a daily basis. It helps you to retain your skills and sharpen them for Algebra 2.

The grades printed on report cards are the reflection of the work you produce. If you want better grades it is up to you to earn better grades through completing assignments, participation and improving test scores. Remember, I don't give grades, rather you earn grades. I will make myself available if you need during the class period and support periods. Do not wait till it is too late. I can be contacted by email if you or your parents have concerns.

CLASSROOM RULES

- ❖ Be in your seat and ready to work when the bell starts to ring.
- ❖ Bring all necessary materials to class daily.
- ❖ Avoid distracting behavior as:
 - ✓ Eating or drinking in class (water bottles are OK);
 - ✓ Talking without permission;
 - ✓ Sitting on the desk or walking over the desk;
 - ✓ Playing beauty shop (no lotion, makeup or nail polish);
 - ✓ Other actions at the teacher's discretion.
- ❖ Secure permission before leaving your seat. However, leaving your seat or the class while the teacher is instructing is not permitted.
- ❖ Have a pass when out of class during the period.
- ❖ Be dismissed by the teacher, not the bell.
- ❖ Be considerate and respectful to your teacher and fellow students.
- ❖ Leave your work area neat for the next group.
- ❖ **ANY FORM OF ELECTRICAL DEVICE THAT IS NOT PERTAINING TO EDUCATION IS PROHIBITED IN CLASS.**

IMPORTANT: Infraction of the above policies will result in points deducted from your study skills grade.

Homework will be assigned and checked each day that the class meets. Most problems require multiple steps including recall of formulas, graphs and algebra steps. If work is not shown, mistakes cannot be found and corrected. Understanding problems will lead to better quiz and exam grades.

MAKE-UP POLICY

Learning a lesson or scheduling a make-up time for a test/quiz that you have been absent for, can be very stressful. Try your best not to be absent from school.

In case that an absence is not avoidable, then you are responsible for learning the lesson you have missed and attending support periods for help. The lesson won't be retaught! It is your responsibility to turn in your missing work including homework and classwork.

In case you miss a test/quiz, they CANNOT be taken during a lesson. It is your responsibility to attend support periods to make it up.

Tests and quizzes must be made up **within 5 school days**. Homework and classwork must be made up **in 2 days** after returning to school. If a test, quiz and/or assignment is not made up during the appropriate window it will be scored 0.

IMPORTANT: If you are present on the day of a quiz/test you **MUST** take it, unless you have missed the **IMMEDIATE INSTRUCTION** day for an excused absence. **Review days are NOT counted as instruction days.**

I will use good faith efforts to have consistent, fair, and equitable policies and consequences within my class regarding the use of AI and shall use good faith efforts to coordinate with other teachers teaching the same class to develop consistent policies and consequences for the use of AI. I will guide and monitor student use of AI, ensuring that it aligns with the District's Student Acceptable Use guidelines and policies. If I suspect that a student has used AI in violation of this policy or against my AI use policy or written instructions for an assignment, I will give the student an opportunity to demonstrate that the use of AI was in accordance with my AI use policy and written instructions for the assignment. If, after the student has been given an opportunity to explain, and I determine that AI was used against the instruction given, the student may be referred to the principal or designee for academic dishonesty ([BP6163.4 Student Use of Technology](#), Use of Artificial Intelligence, Guidelines and Protocols #7)

Important Note: Students' work on assignments or homework that is not permitted or allowed by me will be a violation of my classroom AI policies.

Student Pledge for AI Use (for use in grades 5-12)

As a student of Oak Park High School, I pledge to:
